1. Attainment of an overall **GPA of at least 2.75 on a 4.00 scale** (as calculated by NIU), including transfer credit. GPA is not the only consideration for admission to Early Childhood Studies. The totality of the application, including successful work experience with young children, and the essay questions will be considered.
2. Completion of the following courses with a grade of C or better in each, including transfer credit:

Students should seek advisement early in the academic career for assistance with choosing an emphasis. Transfer students who have met the pre-admission requirements for the major in Early Childhood Studies prior to applying for admission to the university should apply for admission to the major in Early Childhood Studies through either FCNS or TLRN at the same time they apply for admission to the university. Students must be admitted to an emphasis in Early Childhood Studies before they can enroll in the first professional semester. Admission to the selected emphasis is contingent on completing the following prerequisites with a grade of C or better prior to entering the first professional semester:

3. Submit successful results of the completion of the **Illinois Certification Testing System (ICTS) Basic Skills Test**. Click on <http://www.icts.nesinc.com/> for more information.
4. A fingerprint-based criminal background check through the Illinois State Police and Federal Bureau of Investigation using an official NIU Criminal Background Fingerprint Check Authorization is required. This form, as well as instructions for completing and submitting the form, can be obtained from: www.teachercertification.niu.edu.
5. Provide proof of freedom from the communicable disease tuberculosis (TB). MANTOUX test only.
6. Transfer students should request a **major application** from the Department of TLRN or from the School of FCNS (available January 1).
7. Students are required to complete COMD 220 Introduction to Communicative Disorders (3) at NIU before graduation if earning certification through TLRN.

Deadline for admission (fall only): *March 1

*The March 1 deadline is for completed applications. Students must have admission requirements completed by December prior to application. Early application to NIU is encouraged. Although students may be admitted to the university for any semester as a Pre-Early Childhood Studies major, admission directly into the major is limited to the fall semester only.
