1. A minimum overall **GPA of at least 2.50** on a 4.00 scale (as calculated by NIU), including all transferable courses.
2. Completion of all of the following **pre-admission courses** at the time of application with a grade of C or better in each course:

3. Admission into the emphasis in Athletic Training is competitive and all students who meet the above pre-admission requirements will be required to complete the Athletic Training application form including one or more essays (see Item #6).
4. Students must provide documentation with a NATABOC (National Athletic Trainer's Association Board of Certification) certified Athletic Trainer's signature of observation or experience in an Athletic Training setting (paid or voluntary).
5. Students must provide two recommendations from people who are familiar with and/or have supervised the applicant's professional, work-related, or volunteer experiences.
6. Students must complete a special admissions packet that may be obtained from the department advisor's office at 815-753-8285.
7. Transfer students who have met the pre-admission requirements for the emphasis in Athletic Training, prior to applying for admission to the university, should apply for admission through the Department of Kinesiology and P.E. at the same time they apply for admission to the university.
8. Students must be admitted to the emphasis in Athletic Training before they can enroll in KNPE 264 Principles of Injury Prevention and Care (3) and KNPE 265 Practicum in Athletic Training. **Since these courses are not available in transfer, it is recommended that students transfer to NIU after one year at the community college with the above pre-admission courses completed.**
9. Provide evidence of current first aid and cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) certification from a nationally recognized organization (i.e., American Red Cross).
10. Complete the Athletic Training Technical Standards form (included in application packet) with signature.
11. Provide the contract of Understanding for Athletic Training (included in the application packet) with signature.
12. Provide a copy of academic transcripts from all post-secondary institutions attended.

Program application deadline: January 15

(Notification of admission status will be made by March 15.)

Students intending to transfer to NIU should seek academic advisement from their community college counselor.
