Description of Course:

This course is an introduction to international relations and world politics. It includes studies of international relations theory, international conflict, terrorism, globalization, human rights, and poverty. As a corollary the course is designed to illustrate the dynamics of international relations and its issues through case examples from Southeast Asia in general and from the nation of Cambodia specifically. In this way the course introduces students to the discipline of international relations and how these forces shape and influence the region of Southeast Asia and Cambodia.

Course Objectives:

<u>Objective 1</u>: Students will demonstrate concepts of international relations and theories as they relate to the foundation, background, and theory of international relations on an exam, papers, and discussion.

<u>Objective 2</u>: Students will demonstrate concepts of modern global conflict as they relate to America's role in the post-9/11 world and the nature of warfare on an exam, papers, and discussion.

<u>Objective 3</u>: Students will demonstrate concepts of international organizations as they relate to the international system on an exam, papers, and discussion.

Objective 4: Students will demonstrate concepts of globalization and global issues as they relate to the globalization process, human rights/genocide, terrorism, and global poverty on an exam, papers, and discussion.
