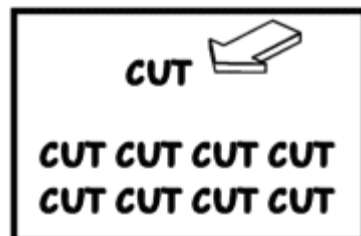
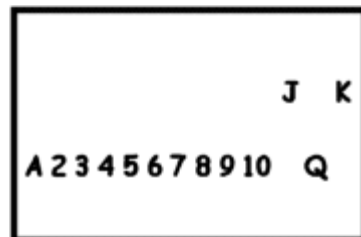

## Holiday Facts

- The first Christmas was celebrated on December 25, AD 336 in Rome.
- Artificial Christmas trees have outsold real ones since 1991.
- St. Nicholas was bishop of the Turkish town of Myra in the early 4th century. The Dutch first made him into a Christmas gift-giver, and Dutch settlers brought him to America where his name eventually became the familiar Santa Claus. Franklin Pierce was the first president to decorate an official White House Christmas tree.
- The Canadian province of Nova Scotia leads the world in exporting lobster, wild blueberries, and Christmas trees.
- Electric Christmas lights were first used in 1854.
- People who kissed under the Mistletoe were to end their grievances with each other.
- In 1882 Thomas Nast drew a cartoon showing Santa sitting on a box addressed "Christmas Box 1882, St. Nicholas, North Pole". Nast just figured it was a good place for Santa to live.
- "White Christmas" (1954), starring Bing Crosby and Danny Kaye, was the first movie to be made in Vista Vision, a deep-focus process.
- "Wassail" comes from the Old Norse "ves heill"--to be of good health. This evolved into the tradition of visiting neighbors on Christmas Eve and drinking to their health.
