

2010-2011 Diversity Scholarship for Freshmen and Transfers
Northern Illinois University
College of Engineering and Engineering Technology (CEET)

The College of Engineering and Engineering Technology recognizes students who have achieved a strong academic record, and who are interested in pursuing an undergraduate degree in engineering or technology. The Diversity Scholarship is awarded to new students who are admitted for the Fall 2010 semester.

THE AWARD

The scholarships are valued at \$1,500 each for one academic year (\$750 per semester), and are not renewable. Application deadline: application must be postmarked or hand delivered by 4:30 pm on February 1, 2010.

ELIGIBILITY

1. Admitted to NIU's College of Engineering and Engineering Technology for the Fall 2010 semester as either a:
 - a. First semester freshmen, possessing a minimum grade point average of 3.25/4.0 and a competitive class rank.
 - b. OR, a transfer student having completed 24 or more semester hours of transferable college work, possessing a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.00/4.00.
2. Must be a U.S. citizen or permanent alien resident of the United States.
3. Must be a member of an under-represented group; African American, Asian, Hispanic, Native American or female.

REQUIREMENTS

1. Students must earn a minimum of 24 semester hours for the academic year of attendance. An academic year will be considered as consecutive Fall and Spring semesters.
2. Students must earn a minimum of 12 semester hours each semester of attendance for Fall and Spring semesters.
3. Students must maintain a cumulative grade point average of 2.50 or above in all NIU course work.
4. Students must be a declared major in the College of Engineering and Engineering Technology for both the Fall 2010 and Spring 2011 semesters.
5. The recipients of this scholarship will be expected to engage in community service pertaining to participation in the CEET project *PATAL: Peer-Assisted Tutoring, Advising and Learning*, working with high schools under the CEET *Adopt-a-High School project*, engage in *Student Association Committee (SAC)* activities, giving college tours, etc. The obligation will not exceed more than 2 hours per week.
