To continue research beyond 9/17/10, students must have completed the mandatory safety training. To continue research beyond October 15, students must have completed and submitted proof of the mandatory ethical conduct of research training.

Before graduation, all CHEM 498/499H students must once: complete the library assignment, submit a 2-3 page research report, and present a seminar, and attend the seminar presentation discussion.

Grading - Providing satisfactory completion of the above assignments, grades will be assigned by faculty research supervisor.
