POSITION: Assistant Professor, Nutrition, Dietetics, and Hospitality Administration

STARTING DATE: August 16, 2009

RESPONSIBILITIES: Teach graduate and undergraduate courses in nutrition, direct undergraduate practical field experiences; direct student research; maintain an active program of scholarship related to nutrition; pursue external funding; participate in departmental and university committee work, including curriculum and program development.

QUALIFICATIONS: Required by date of appointment—Earned dietetic registration (RD), doctorate in human nutrition, dietetics, or related field with strength in nutrition sciences, evidence of an emerging record of scholarship, and strong interpersonal and teamwork skills. College teaching experience, dietetics practice experience, and scholarly publications preferred.

GENERAL INFORMATION: Northern Illinois University is located 65 miles west of Chicago and has an enrollment of approximately 25,000 students. Nutrition, Dietetics, and Hospitality Administration (NDHA) is one of three areas within the School of Family, Consumer, and Nutrition Sciences which is located in the College of Health and Human Sciences. NDHA offers four programs: a B. S. degree with two emphases, hospitality administration and nutrition and dietetics (DPD); a minor in nutrition, dietetics, and hospitality administration, a M.S. degree in nutrition and dietetics; and a dietetic internship available as a supplement to the graduate program. NDHA faculty members contribute to the Graduate Certificate in Eating Disorders and Obesity. The School has 22 full-time faculty members and six supportive professional staff.
