Dear Teacher:

Welcome to The Stock Market Game™ (SMG) program. Our records indicate you are either new to the SMG program or have not participated in recent semesters. We look forward to working with you to bring this exciting simulation to your students. If at any time you have questions regarding the program, please feel free to contact our office.

You should have received your administrative login ID and password immediately upon completion of the registration process; student team IDs are assigned the following business night, but no earlier than three weeks prior to the start of the session for which you registered. If the number of team ID's you receive is not correct, or does not match your needs, please contact us at your earliest convenience.

Please note that for teams to be eligible to receive any awards, our funders require that teams contain between three and five students. Award-eligible teams without a minimum of three students, or having more than five students, will be disqualified, and the next qualifying team moved up in rank. *If you need to add teams, or delete unused teams at any time during a session, please notify us and we will edit your registration and send you a revised team list.*
