

Getting Into Graduate School Seminar (GIGSS)

GIGSS is a 7 week seminar dedicated to helping undergraduates in psychology prepare for the graduate school application process. Components of the seminar include (but are not limited to):

- How to decide what program is right for you
- What experiences are crucial (e.g., research experience)
 - How to write a CV and a personal statement
- How to prepare for the GRE and what to expect
 - How to request letters of recommendation

- GIGSS will meet every other Thursday at 5:00pm in Spring 2011
 - Includes a lecture and a workshop component
 - Students will receive individual feedback on work samples
 - Not a formal class, no enrollment fee *or* class credit, NO cost
- The program is most beneficial to students planning on applying to Ph.D. programs; however, it is open to students applying to any psychology graduate degree program (e.g., M.A., Ph.D., Psy.D.)
