Athletic Board had a huge success in their week of giving; they surpassed \$1,000,000 for the second year in a row; they've raised over \$3 million since 2017 and they have a lot of momentum built behind some of their facilities projects including tennis, baseball, and softball.

Parking Appeals Committee heard 44 appeals; 17 approved; 22 denied and 5 reduced fine.

Andrew Rogers is going to compare the 2017 and 2022 data side-by-side to develop a framework for making some useful comparisons. Joe Lovelace is exploring some of the mechanisms and processes in CMS and HR to audit and classify positions to try and answer the following questions: What is unique to your being SPS? What is a vital role? What is the vital role of SPS employees in the NIU system? What are some things this committee as well as the SPS Council, as a whole, can influence?

<u>Awards</u>: Megan Woodruff reported that given the additional information they got this morning, the committee will start reviewing that and bring some suggestions forward to the Council.

<u>Communications & Technology</u>: Dan Wolfe reported the committee was still figuring out how to manage the website, creating a newsletter and other steps such as survey information. Regarding increasing visibility of the SPS Personnel Advisor, the committee is still working on drafting that. President Bohanon noted this was a high priority need and would like to have a draft to share with the Council at the January 12 meeting.

<u>Constitution & Elections</u>: Tom O'Grady reported he had been reviewing the Constitution as it is due for an update, particularly about the committee structure. It was suggested that each committee write up a brief description of what your committee does to provide a starting point

for updating the committee structure and functions. Also discussed, and President Bohanon asked for feedback on, was not meeting in June and July.
