President's Invited Speaker

Cynthia Willett

Emory University

Dr. Willett is an Associate Professor of Philosophy at Emory in ethics, social and political philosophy, philosophy of literature, and race and gender studies. She is author of *the Soul of Justice* (Cornell, 2002), *Maternal Ethics* (Routledge, 1995), and edited collection, *Theorizing Multiculturalism* (Blackwell, 1998). She is currently writing a fourth book called *Comic Catharsis and Social Freedom*.

The title for her plenary address is

The Social Element: A Phenomenology of Racialized Space

Liberal traditions of social policy focus on individual or institutional racism as well as individual choice as the primary factors for racial segregation. But not all racial segregation can be accounted for by these factors. What is the space that we inhabit as social creatures? How might we capture the effect of this space on our sense of individuality and freedom?

Merleau-Ponty's poetics of space, and the Greek mythos upon which he draws this poetics, gives us some sense of the space we inhabit; it also gives us the basis for a broader social humanism.
