HUMAN RIGHTS ARE THE SUPREME, INHERENT AND INALIENABLE RIGHTS TO LIFE, TO DIGNITY AND TO SELF DEVELOPMENT. IT IS THE ESSENCE OF THESE RIGHTS THAT MAKES MAN/WOMAN HUMAN.

RIGHT TO LIFE:

- To health
- To own property
- To work
- To form trade unions and to strike
- To social security
- To rest and leisure
- To move about freely within our country and freely to leave and return to it,
- To marry, to establish a family

RIGHT TO DIGNITY:

- Recognition everywhere as a person
- To honor and reputation
- To freedom of thought, conscience and religion
- To freedom of speech/expression
- To seek, receive, impart information
- To peaceful assembly with our fellows
- To equal treatment before the law
- To privacy in our family, home and our correspondence

- To freedom from slavery
- To freedom from torture and cruel, inhuman or degrading punishment
- To free from arbitrary arrest, detention or exile
- To be presumed innocent of crime or wrong
- To a fair trial
- Against ex-post facto law

RIGHT TO SELF-DEVELOPMENT

- To education
- To share in the cultural life of our community
- To form associations
- To live in a nation and international order that allows all of our rights to flower and be respected

HUMAN RIGHTS ENTAIL BOTH RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS

- Obligation to Respect means that States must refrain from interfering with or curtailing the enjoyment of human rights.
- Obligation to Protect requires States to protect individuals and groups against human rights abuses.
- Obligation to fulfill means that States must take positive action to facilitate the enjoyment of basic human rights.
