Degree Requirements

Art history is an interdisciplinary enterprise connecting to fields of anthropology, philosophy, literature, religion, science and technology. The bachelor of arts in art history at NIU emphasizes critical thinking and creativity while promoting the understanding of regions other than our own - a crucial skill in a globalized world. A diverse faculty offers courses in Western and non-Western, pre-modern, modern, and contemporary art and design, as well as courses in museum studies.
