Happy Winter, 2013! If you haven't had the opportunity to come visit the museum galleries to see the Vice and Virtue show yet - do try; it runs through February 23rd and we still have several related programming events including interpretive modern dance in the galleries.

Just as visual artists have been inspired by this topic for centuries, NIU School of Theatre and Dance Professor Paula Frasz has invited her students to develop short interpretive dance pieces in response to the exhibition with a special focus on the Seven Deadly Sins. These performances will take place starting at 12:15 p.m. Wednesday, February 20th; 7:15 p.m. Thursday, February 21st; and 1:00 p.m. Saturday, February 23rd.





Some of you may remember that we worked with Professor Frasz and her students several years ago when they interpreted our Art and Technology exhibition. Seeing the visual and performing arts converge in this way provides an intimate and exciting way to explore more fully both art forms.

Peter Olson, our Assistant Director, made some innovative experiments when curating and installing the Vice and Virtue exhibition. While the first impulse was to lay the show out with one gallery for vice and one for virtue, Pete's research confirmed a suspicion that artists might tend to veer toward vice as topic or else would likely explore both themes within one work. Using a black and white palette to emphasize the assumed polarity of the theme, he layered this with the glow of colored lights to highlight the ambiguity that sometimes exists between virtuous and vice-like acts.

Pete ended up intermingling topical works by over forty artists as he interspersed artwork from different eras, techniques and styles, mingling contemporary work with master prints, folk art and outsider art, pop culture and high culture. Wanting to provide an interactive element, he set up a display of Andy Warhol's Polaroid portraits with moveable labels so that gallery visitors can label the image with one of the seven virtues or seven vices to personally explore how readily one's interpretation may be impacted. The exhibition also includes a bulletin board for visitors to add items and share comments on the nature of vice and virtue.

We are very excited about the show; stop by to see it before it closes on the 23rd!


SOUTH GALLERIES: April 4 - May 24


MAPPING: Measuring Across Place and Period; Information, Navigation, and Geography

This exhibition focuses on the utility and aesthetics of ancient and modern maps and explores contemporary artistic interpretation of maps and mapping devices. This show will be curated by Museum Studies 656 students.


