## **HLC Accreditation**

- NIU has been accredited by the Higher Learning Commission (HLC) since 1915.
- HLC is one of the seven regional accrediting agencies recognized by the U.S. Department of Education.
- NIU's last comprehensive evaluation occurred in 2014 and the university was reaccredited by HLC for 10 years (until 2024), the maximum period possible.



## The Importance of Accreditation

- It's required for NIU to receive federal funds.
- Together with specialized accreditations, it assures the public of our legitimacy.
- It's an opportunity to take stock of, and celebrate, our accomplishments.




### **HLC Accreditation Process**

Final year of the cycle: Comprehensive Evaluation



# **Assurance Argument**

- NIU will submit an assurance argument, along with materials of evidence, to demonstrate that we follow HLC's criteria for accreditation.
- The peer review team will review these materials in preparation for their on-site visit.





Criterion 1 Mission The institution's mission is clear and articulated publicly; it guides the institution's operations.

#### **Criterion 2**

Integrity: Ethical and Responsible Conduct The institution's mission is clear and articulated publicly; it guides the institution's operations.

#### **Criterion 3**

Teaching and Learning: Quality, Resources and Support The institution provides quality education, wherever and however its offerings are delivered.

- Affirm our overall academic quality and financial sustainability and integrity.



## **Campus Feedback**


The university opened the assurance argument to the campus community from November – January.





## **Federal Compliance Review**



# **Student Opinion Survey**


- Distributed via email two months prior to the peer review team's on-site visit.

- Agenda for visit typically includes meetings with leadership and board, and open forums with faculty, staff and students.






### **On-Site Peer Review Visit-Faculty Meetings**
