If you purchase a used text, be sure you are getting the 10th edition; if the book is very cheap, you are probably paying - and paying too much - for an old edition. Students often ask if they can use an old edition. My response is this: You are solely responsible for completing all assignments, which will be pegged to the 10th edition. If your edition is missing something, it will be your responsibility to figure out what's missing and do the reading. If you purchase an old edition (which, in case it's not clear, I really don't recommend), then under no circumstances should you get anything later than the 9th edition."
