In June 2020 members of OSC expressed a desire to help civil service employees who were experiencing financial hardship and the Civil Service Emergency Fund (CSEF) was established. New Mask Guidelines Effective Feb. 28, 2022

Illinois Governor Pritzker has announced that, effective Monday, Feb. 28, the state will discontinue its mask mandate for K-12 schools and follow the CDC's new guidelines for when and where masks are required. Given this new development and the university's agreement with the NIU faculty and instructors unions for this academic year, NIU will only require masks in the following circumstances and/or locations:

- · Faculty members can require masks be worn in their teaching spaces.
- Public transportation.
- Surveillance testing locations.
- Northwestern Medicine Student Health Clinic.
- NIU health clinics.
- NIU Child and Family Development Center.

Huskies are also expected to wear masks at the request of individuals when meeting in the personal work or living spaces of those individuals.

Masks will be optional in all other settings. Any member of the NIU community who prefers to continue to mask is welcome and encouraged to do so.

What is Student Financial Advising Services?

Student Financial Advising Services (SFAS) is a new campus office established in April 2021 and currently located in Campus Life 260. SFAS was established as part of an initiative to provide current and prospective students with a positive customer service experience that will promote their success, retention and on-time graduation at NIU through financial education.

Our financial advisors educate and advise all students and their family members on:

- Financial aid (applying, interpreting/understanding, accepting).
- Tuition and fees (completing cost estimator, reviewing charges, balances, payment options).
- General financial literacy (reviewing cost projections and options for paying for college, developing a multi-year financial plan and more).

Other topics discussed include applying for scholarships, searching for student employment (including work-study information) and much more.

The financial advisors are also able to connect students to other campus support resources and services in alignment with partnerships across campus. Along with our campus partners, we are part of a community of care and support.

Students can schedule a one-on-one appointment with one of our financial advisors via our <u>website</u>. They will find a calendar with available dates and times and can select what works best for their schedule.

Virtual and phone appointments are available in English or Spanish during traditional business hours, as well as on evenings and weekends. We will be offering in-person appointments as the need arises.

In addition to the above, our financial advisors, with the assistance of our GradReady online learning modules, can help students learn about money management, increase their understanding about loans and loan repayment, learn important financial life skills such as building a budget and other real-world finance needs.

Work Request Desk/Facility Emergencies

The Northern Illinois University Work Request Desk is located at the Physical Plant. Hours of operation are Monday through Friday, 7:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. The desk receives repair/install requests for building maintenance including: Carpenters, electricians, elevator repair, key control, masons, painters, plumbers, refrigeration, remodeling requests/capital improvement, cooling/heating/ventilation, window treatments, carpet, upholstering, snow removal, barricades, irrigation, landscaping, pest control, lawn and plaint maintenance, ergonomic assessment and extra building cleaning.

To place a request that does not need immediate attention, complete an <u>online request</u>. Additional facility management links are available at this location as well. Work requests that need immediate attention can be submitted by calling 815-753-1741 and following the voice-recorded prompts. Email correspondence can be sent to <u>workorder@niu.edu</u>.
