The new <u>budget website</u> has launched. This is the first phase of the website, so check back often for more information.



Confessions of a Seasoned Huskie



Meet Renee Page, administrative assistant in the CLAS Dean's Office since Sept. 24, 1994. With 30 years at NIU, Page's journey is a testament to adaptability, hard work and an enduring love for the NIU community. Let's dive into her story.

Renee, how did you end up working at NIU?

I had been laid off from my previous job for a few months. I was interviewing for anything and everything. I interviewed with VPA External Programs, and by the time I got home, the director had called to let me know she planned to offer me the job. I promised to stay at least a year — that was 30 years ago.

What a lucky hire for NIU — 30 years and counting! How many positions have you held at NIU, and why or why didn't you switch?

I've held two positions. In my position in CVPA, I was able to take on more duties and move up in that position. I really loved working with the Community School of the Arts and the summer arts camps because I love music and theater. After 17 years, I decided I needed a change, even though anyone who knows me knows I'm a creature of habit. I was offered the admin position in the CLAS Dean's Office, and I have never regretted making the move. I've considered applying for other positions, but I'm pretty happy where I am. However, I don't necessarily advise people to do what I did, as I skipped over levels on the secretarial line, which left my salary lower than that of people who had moved up one level at a time.

What's the most spontaneous thing you've ever done?

My friend and I were traveling in Maine, and at the spur of the moment, we decided to take the Super Ferry from Bar Harbor to Nova Scotia. It was a four-hour trip each way for us to spend two hours in that province, but it was worth it! It's a beautiful area, and I'd love to go back.

Four hours each way for just two hours? Now that's dedication to adventure! What's at the top of your bucket list? I really want to go to Australia and stop in a few different places around the country, like Uluru, Kakadu National Park and the Great Barrier Reef. I'm fascinated by the history and cultures of that country.

What tips can you share that helped you make it at NIU for all your years here?

Be flexible. The one thing you can be certain of at NIU is that things will change, whether it's a new boss, new procedures, new software or new coworkers. You can have some time to come to terms with it, but change will come no matter whether you want it or not. Sometimes the changes are great, sometimes they are not so good, and sometimes it just doesn't work out, but you have to be able to go with the flow and work through it.

What do you do after a stressful day at work?

What I should do is go to the gym. What I usually do is put on my comfiest clothes and escape into a book for an hour or two. Chocolate is usually included.

Sounds like the perfect recipe for stress relief to me! Where do you like to go on vacation?

Everywhere and anywhere. I've been to 49 states and five countries. I can't wait for retirement next year so I have more time to get out and see the world.

And what do you do there?

We enjoy hiking, kayaking, and visiting national parks and monuments. We try to find unique things to do as well. We've gone snorkeling with the stingrays, whale watching, dog sledding and kayaking with manatees. One time, we doubled back on a vacation so we could go to an amethyst mine in Canada and dig through the trailings.

Describe your proudest (work or personal) accomplishment.

My proudest work accomplishment was receiving the Board of Trustees Staff Award last year. It was truly an honor to have the university acknowledge my years of hard work.

What's your favorite recipe or the recipe you're known for?

I love cooking and do volunteer work for Taste of Home magazine. My current favorite recipe is one-pot rotini with tomato cream sauce. However, the recipe I'm known for is Bloody Mary pot roast, cooked in an instant pot. The recipe won third place in a Taste of Home contest.

Very nice! Those recipes sound delicious. Cooking is such a great talent. Thanks again for taking the time to tell us about yourself. We have such wonderful employees here with a variety of backgrounds and experiences.
