The meeting was called to order by GCCC Chair Howell.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA

Mantzke made a motion, seconded by James, TO APPROVE THE AGENDA FOR THE FEBRUARY 13, 2017, GCCC MEETING. **Motion passed unanimously.**

Smith reported that she makes sure departments have included a nonduplication statement and if not she will ask for one prior to GCCC meeting. Smith said that for the new courses on today's agenda, if they get approved by the GCCC and then the Graduate Council in March, they will be able to be offered in the fall 2017. She added that she checked with these departments to make sure they do want to offer them in the fall. While the new courses would not be in the 2017-18 Graduate Catalog, they would be added to the MyNIU catalog so that students may enroll in them. James made a motion, second by Sahinoglu, TO APPROVE THE CONSENT AGENDA. Motion passed unanimously.
