NIU BYLAWS ARTICLE 17: OTHER STANDING COMMITTEES OF THE UNIVERSITY

17.5 Faculty Representative to the Illinois Board of Higher Education

17.5.1 The Faculty Senate shall elect a tenured faculty member to serve on the Faculty Advisory Council to the Illinois Board of Higher Education. The person so elected shall serve a four-year, renewable term beginning at the start of the fall semester. The person shall receive annual compensation equal to one month of the median salary of all tenured faculty. If not otherwise a member, the person shall serve as an ex officio nonvoting member of the Faculty Senate and the University Council.

The Faculty Advisory Council to the IBHE meets monthly on Fridays. The meetings convene at 9 a.m. and adjourn at approximately 2:30-3 p.m. Each meeting is held at a different institution of higher education throughout the state. The person in this position is required to attend these monthly meetings on a regular, consistent basis (travel reimbursement is provided).

The person in this position also is expected to communicate to both Faculty Senate and University Council regarding issues related to the FAC and to NIU. Faculty Senate and University Council each meet monthly on Wednesdays at 3 p.m.
