## SCOPE AND CONTENT

This collection documents the activities of the Rockford League of Women Voters from its founding in 1922 to the present. The collection is divided into four series. Included in Series I, Organizational Records, is historical materials, by-laws, minutes of meetings, correspondence, and newsletters. Subject Files comprise Series II, and are arranged alphabetically. Among the broad range of topics covered in the series are nuclear power, China, education, ERA, flood control, housing, and the status of women. Most of the files fall within the 1960-1985 time period. Series III contains scrapbooks spanning the years from 1922-1978. They are especially useful in documenting the League's activities before WW II. Series IV, Byron Nuclear Plant Intervention, along with the DAARE/SAFE Collection (RC 212), documents the League's involvement in the joint plant intervention.

## HISTORICAL SKETCH

The Rockford League of Women Voters was founded April 22, 1922, two years after the state organization had been established. Among the Rockford Leagues's charter members were: Julia Lathrop, noted for her work on the Children's Bureau and the League of Nation's Commission; Mabel Ashton Johnson, the founder of the Visiting Nurses Association; and Kate O'Connor, a founder of the State League of Women Voters and coordinator of Illinois' welfare program for women and children. The Rockford League's first President was Mrs. William C. Free.

Through a concentration on such topics as International Relations, Economic Welfare, Government Structure, Public Health, and Voter Services, the Rockford League pursues its purpose "...to promote political responsibility through informed and active participation of citizens in government." (By-laws, amended April 26, 1980). These efforts have involved the Rockford League in redevelopment projects, the push for a state constitutional convention, and a

serious review of local government structure. In all their activities, the Rockford League of Women Voters remains politically nonpartisan.

## Series IV. Byron Nuclear Plant Intervention

The Rockford League of Women Voters along with the organizations DeKalb Area Alliance for the Environment (DAARE) and Sinnissippi Alliance for the Environment (SAFE) filed formal petitions with the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) requesting public hearings on NRC plans to issue and operating license for the Byron Nuclear Power Plant. All three organizations were granted intervenor status. The records documenting the League's intervention were donated by Betty Johnson on August 6, 1993. These records are organized using the same series and subseries as the DAARE/SAFE Collection (RC 212). This enables easier accessibility for the researcher when dealing with both collections.
