INTRODUCTION

Mike Wayman, John Gent's nephew, donated the John L. Gent Collection to the Joiner History Room whom later donated the items to the Regional History Center for proper care on September 15, 2016. Gent's items were saved over the years by his sister, Elizabeth Gent Smith.

Property rights in the collection belong to the Regional History Center, literary rights are dedicated to the public. There are no access restrictions to the collection.

SCOPE AND CONTENT

Materials in the John L. Gent collection date from 1905 to 1946, but are predominantly from the years leading up to and including World War II (1936-1945). While serving Gent collected artifacts significant to his time at war. These artifacts represent a large portion of the collection and include foreign paper money and coins as well as military arm bands, patches, ribbons, pins, and belt buckles. Nazi Party propaganda postcards, many of which feature Hitler, are also included in the collection. A small part of the collection consists of U.S. Army publications given to serviceman during WWII.

Researchers interested in war propaganda may also be interested in the collection of World War I & II posters found in RC 200.

HISTORICAL SKETCH

John L. Gent was born October 14, 1906 in DeKalb, Illinois. He enlisted in the U.S. Army on June 30, 1941 in Chicago. He was a member of the 183rd Field Artillery Battalion in WWII, which were a part of the VII U.S. Corps under the command of Lieutenant General J. Lawton Collins. They fought in campaigns including Normandy, Northern France, Rhineland (Germany), Ardennes-Alsace (Belgium/Battle of the Bulge), and Central Europe. He died on October 24, 1971 and was buried in St. Mary Cemetery located in DeKalb. His military headstone reads, "Tec 5, 183rd Field Artillery Battalion."
